CSC Policy on Conflict Minerals

As defined in 2010 United States legislation, Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, Section 1502(e)(4):

CONFLICT MINERAL.—The term “conflict mineral” means—

- (A) columbite-tantalite (coltan), cassiterite, gold, wolframite, or their derivatives; or
- (B) any other mineral or its derivatives determined by the Secretary of State to be financing conflict in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or an adjoining country.

While we, as a privately held corporation, are not subject to the Conflict Minerals rules and reporting requirements, we are committed to helping our customers comply with their reporting requirements. Century Spring requires its suppliers to provide statements of compliance to Conflict Mineral Regulations and state that they do not knowingly purchase conflict materials.

According to information available to us, the material for our products do not contain any of the defined “conflict minerals” like coltan, niobium, tantalum, tin, gold or tungsten from the Democratic Republic of Congo or its adjoining countries. We will continue to work with our key suppliers to ensure that we are able to identify the use of Conflict Minerals in our supply chain, and the representations made in this compliance statement remain accurate. To that end, we reserve the right to amend this statement at any time based on subsequent developments or information.
